Join us next year as we celebrate, connect and co-create at the 10th anniversary of SIEW from 23 to 27 October 2017.

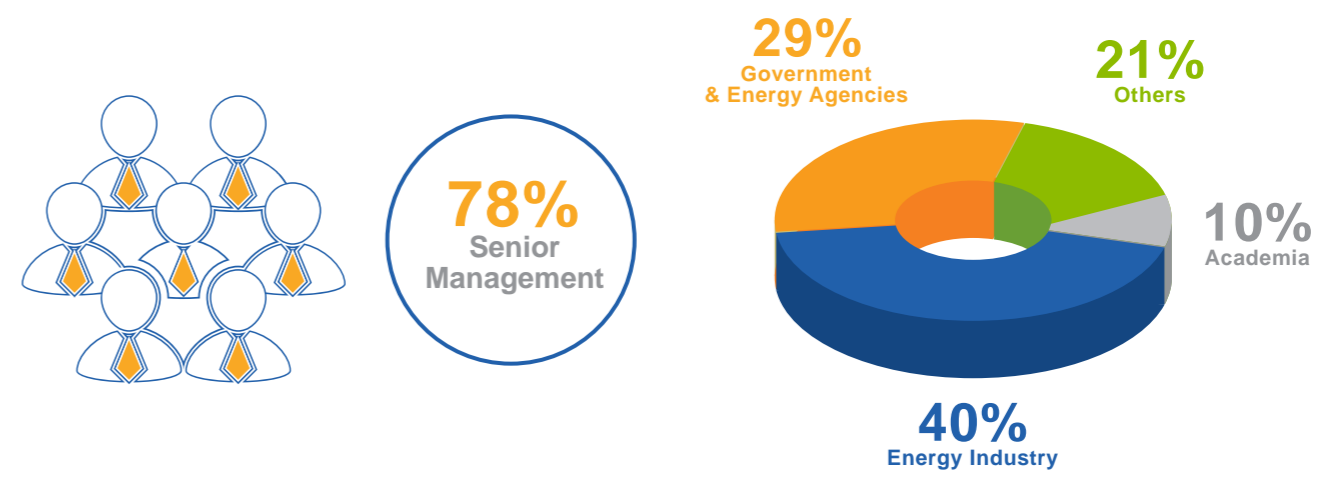
